AT for RSIs

Headset: to avoid bending neck to talk on standard phone Desk that can raise and lower (Uplift Desk)

Vertical Mouse:

Keeps wrist and forearm in a more neutral position (Airo2Bic Mouse)

Trackball Mouse:

Allows for moving mouse with thumb or finger instead of "windshield wiper" motion.

Ergonomic Keyboard:

splitkeyboard (Kinesis Freestlye 2)

Resources to consider:

Assistive Technology Loan Program (ATLP) - To receive a financial loan from \$500 - \$50,000 for AT

<u>Center for Independent Living (CIL)</u> – mentoring, skills training, advocacy, AT, transition assistance

DORS Blindness and Vision Loss Program (OBVS) – career guidance and assessment, AT, vocational / academic education, job placement, independent living skills training.

MD Dept. of Aging (MDOA) – Continuing education, transportation opportunities, durable medical equipment, and more!

Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP) Workforce Development Adult Learning – individuals are given a training assignment that closely matches their personal goals for employment. Training assignments are coordinated with non-profit government agencies (20 hours/week) @ established minimum wage hourly rate (must meet required criteria to be considered).

Senior Service America Inc.: Center for Workforce Inclusion – skill assessment, training, post-placement mentoring for veterans, woman, formerly incarcerated job seekers.
